

MEET SCOTT DAHLKE

We welcomed Scott Dahlke to MCSA as Program Director in mid July. He stepped in as Maggie Curry transitioned into her new role "retirement".

Tell us about your background...

"After college I ran a program for the New York District Kiwanis Foundation serving over 1000 at risk youth and 200 disabled adults annually. My most significant accomplishment was drastically reducing high risk behaviors by utilizing creative programing. From there I went to North Carolina and worked for a Wilderness Therapy program. As the Director of this program, I was proud of the 85% success rate and the progress the teens made in our school system. After moving to lowa, I worked for the Robert Young Center. When the Robert Young Center opened an office in

Muscatine, I gladly filled that office and assisted in developing their Care Coordination Program growing from 1 employee to 8 and helped integrate mental health service in the Muscatine Community."

What brought you to MCSA?

"Working in the "garden level" at MCSA in the Robert Young Center, I was often consulted on some of the clients MCSA assisted at the shelter. When Maggie approached me about applying for her position I thought it would be a great opportunity to help members of our community who are historically underserved."

What do you like most about MCSA?

"I love any opportunity to break the cycle of poverty."

What has been your biggest surprise since coming to work at MCSA?

"Getting to see how supportive our community is was very eye opening. MCSA wouldn't exist without the support of this town and seeing the number of people who can get energized by our mission is exciting."

Where do you see MCSA in 5 years, 10 years?

"In five years I would like to see MCSA utilizing unique collaborative techniques to address issues leading to first time homelessness. In 10 years I would like to see MCSA as a leader at implementing strategies to tackle the systematic causes of sustained homelessness."

We enjoyed hosting Halloween at the Y again this year while the Y is under construction. It was a wonderful evening!






FIREWORK FUNDRAISER

Muscatine Youth Group stopped by for a tour and brought adorable hand-made blankets for the children.




200—6th grade students from CMS toured MCSA in October. They raised \$350.25 for MCSA during their penny war challenge and collected jars of peanut butter and jelly.

Dear Scott Dahlke,


