MCSA Housing Grant Ranks #1

We are so delighted to announce that MCSA's grant application for the Dept. of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Continuum of Care funding competition was ranked the highest in the state of Iowa! An independent committee called the Continuum of Care committee performed scoring, and out of 35 total applicants, MCSA's application held the top spot with an overall score of **98.3 percent**. This HUD grant supports our Rapid Rehousing initiative, which helps those who are homeless be quickly placed into stable and affordable housing. MCSA is excited to continue to seek funding opportunities that address homelessness and affordable housing!

MCSA Food Programs

At MCSA, we want to fill as many gaps in needs as possible for our community, one of these being food insecurity. Our Food Programs are available to anyone in the community finding themselves in need of a hot meal and/or supply of food to take home.

Our community Lunch Program runs daily Monday-Friday 12:15pm-12:45pm in our lower level dining room at 312 Iowa Avenue. We have been serving nearly 100 people daily with food donated from our community.

The Food Pantry operates Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10:00am-12:00pm in our lower level. Nearly 400 people are visiting each week and taking food home to feed their families. Much of the food at the pantry comes from local donations from businesses and community members, and we are so grateful for the support!

Pet Food Pantry

She hosts the pantry on the third Wednesday of each month at First Presbyterian Church in downtown Muscatine from 8:00am-10:00am.
